Message from the Chair



It is always an exciting time of the year in the Weill Department of Medicine as we welcome the results of the match. We very much appreciate the efforts of many of our faculty in the interview and recruitment process. This year, our program, under Dr. Kirana Gudi's leadership, welcomes a total of 45 new graduates who will join us in June as interns. 36 of these are in our Categorical program, 4 in Primary Care, and 5 in the Medical Research track (2 in Hematology/Oncology, 2 in Gastroenterology, and 1 in Rheumatology). They come from 27 medical schools across the country. There are 28 women and 17 men, with 11 underrepresented in medicine and 10 are Weill Cornell graduates. Special thanks to Margie Daly and Karla Jacome for their efforts and to Drs. Adrian Majid, Helene Strauss, Alexandra King, Peggy Leung, Jeff Silberzweig, Todd Cutler, and Kyu Rhee for their leadership.

We continue to recruit the most outstanding medical school graduates to our program, which bodes well for our future.
